

THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION- THE SACRAMENT OF MERCY

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available every Saturday from 4:15 to 5:00 PM. This is an important Sacrament in which we experience the Mercy of God. Who should come to confession? Everyone should come to this sacrament. Why should we come? We should come if we are interested in growing in discipleship. No one is perfect. Neither the priest, the pope nor the bishop, not even are you. Confession is self accusatory without explanations. It is a place where we face ourselves and our motives, not only for doing evil, but even our motives for doing good. Are all our good acts other centered or may they too be self centered? It is in discussing the state of our Spirit that we can get back on track. Who should go to Eucharist? Those who are seeking to follow Christ. Those who are struggling to follow the Gospel even with occasional falls and errors. Those whose heart is going towards Christ on Christ's terms not their own. Who should not go to communion? Those who are aware of grave and serious sin which has not been confessed in the Sacrament of Reconciliation should refrain from the Eucharist until they have spoken to the priest of the state of their life. Never be afraid to approach the priest with whom you can relate. Situations which may be embarrassing, off color, of sexual nature, of criminal nature, the priest is there for forgiveness and healing. He has heard it all previously. The good thing is, he forgets. Remember no one is perfect. We, including the priest, all struggle, even with ourselves, to live the Gospel. So, come and be forgiven, be filled with Grace and keep moving to a deeper relationship with the Lord.

From the Pastor

Dear Parish Family:

Can one have a good esteem and still be humble?

The readings address the virtue of humility. In the Gospel, Jesus addresses the virtue of humility as he attends a Shabbat dinner while watching the guests striving for the seats of honor. In the First Reading from the Book of Sirach, which is part of the Wisdom Literature of the Hebrew Texts, humility means the truth about ourselves. In truth, we have many blessings and gifts for which we are thankful. In truth, we also have weaknesses, faults and shortcomings. Is it not possible to admit both and accept ourselves as loved by God, family and friends?

The sacred text invites us to humbly accept our giftedness. In the Book of Sirach 10:27f, we are told to have self esteem with humility. While self esteem is important, balance is also important. In recent years, society has emphasized the importance of self esteem to the point of avoiding saying anything negative to our children. We are overly concerned with not hurting one's self esteem that we avoid correcting students' spelling or grammar or behavior. We, at times, have sacrificed speaking the truth with love and kindness so as not to offend the self-esteem of others. The result is that we have misled many by not addressing issues which in the end could have helped everyone to learn and to mature. In some cases, we have created a generation of entitled individuals who act as though the world owes them for simply being present among us.

To have self esteem with humility means that we can admit strengths and still admit our weaknesses without feeling inferior. In true humility, we must admit that no one knows everything about everything. No one is so smart as to have all the answers to every question. In truth, we are all limited and all of us make errors. Also in truth, we must admit we do know a great deal and that some are blessed with great insight and intelligence. In true humility, the more one recognizes one's gifts, the more one should realize how small we are in light of God. The more one also realizes that everyone can learn from every person, the more humble we become. Humility means truth, it does not mean humiliation or embarrassment.

We are who we are, with our gifts and with our limitations. Perhaps a lesson can be learned from our medicine cabinets in our homes. Look at any prescription which you have been given. Notice that there is a dosage to each prescription. Too much of a particular medication or too little of the medication can be dangerous to our health. So too with humility and self esteem; too much of either can be dangerous to our social, emotional and psychological health. The one with true self esteem is humble.
