### TO ALL

As we hear and meditate on the Passion/Death and Resurrection of Christ during this week and Holy Week, I ask all to keep in mind that these events are the founding events of our faith. Please all remember the following:

“Even though the Jewish authorities and those who followed their lead pressed for the death of Christ, neither all Jews indiscriminately at that time, nor Jews today can be charged with the crimes committed during his passion. It is true that the Church is the new people of God, yet the Jews should not be spoken of as rejected or accursed as if this followed from the Holy Scriptures. Consequently, all must take care lest in catechizing or preaching the Word of God, they teach anything which is not in accord with the truth of the Gospel message or the spirit of Christ.

Indeed the Church proves every form of persecution against whomsoever it may be directed. Remembering then her common heritage with the Jews and moved not by any political consideration, but solely by religious motivation of Christian charity, she (The Church) deplores all hatreds, persecutions, displays of anti-Semitism leveled at any time or from any source against the Jews.

The Church always held and continues to hold that Christ out of love freely underwent suffering and death because of the sins of all men, so that all might attain salvation. It is the duty of the Church, therefore, in her preaching to proclaim the cross or Christ as a sign of God’s universal love and source of all grace. (Nostra Aetate 28 October 1965 Vatican II Document)

# From the Pastor

Dear Parish Community,

Today is the Fifth Sunday of Lent. The giving of a New Covenant, the establishing of a new relationship between God and humanity is the uniting theme of today's Liturgy of the Word. This New Covenant, this new relationship between God and humanity comes about through the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus. It is for this Hour that Jesus has come, the Hour of his glorification through Death to Resurrection.

The Great Paschal Mystery is pointed to in the second reading from the Letter to the Hebrews and the Gospel. In the first reading from the Book of the Prophet Jeremiah, the prophet announces that God will make a New Covenant with the people. This new covenant will be different from the past. This new covenant will be written in the hearts of the people. Christianity sees this promise of the New Covenant fulfilled in Christ who is the new covenant. In the second reading from Hebrews and the Gospel, we have an allusion to the prayer of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. In Hebrews, we are told that Jesus prayed with tears and supplications. In the Gospel according to St. John, we read that Jesus was troubled because his hour had come. The New Covenant will come to be through the Blood of Christ. Blood means life. The covenant or the relationship we have with God is in Jesus.

In a covenant is a special relationship. During this Lenten Season we read about the covenant between God and the world in the story of Noah. We read about the covenant between Abraham and God in the story of the sacrifice of Isaac. We read about the relationship and covenant with Moses with the giving of the Ten Commandments. In each covenant people both as a group and individually encountered God.

The New Covenant is communal and individual. Our Covenant is not in a written text. Our covenant is not a series of Laws. Our covenant is in a person. It is in the person of Christ Jesus, the Incarnate Word of God that we encounter God and have our New Covenant. The way into this covenant and redemption in Christ is through the Sacrament of Baptism. Baptism is nourished by the Eucharist. Jesus becomes sin for us. This means that Jesus is the victim of hatred, jealousy, religious self-righteousness, greed for power, rejection. It is because of Christ's faithfulness to the Will of the Father that we will die. The Will of the Father is not willing Jesus' death, but rather the Father wills: love, mercy, justice, peace, joy, goodness, faithfulness, humility, kindness, chastity, gentleness, generosity, self-control, forgiveness. Throughout his life and during his passion, Jesus has been faithful to these behaviors. We are redeemed and forgiven because where humanity was and is unfaithful, Jesus is most faithful. His faithfulness to all God wants redeems our unfaithfulness.

Being a committed member of the Body of Christ calls us to renounce certain behaviors which are against the Gospel and to adhere to other behaviors which foster the Gospel. This commitment can cause us to make difficult choices for the Gospel and to suffer for those choices. This suffering can take the form of being ostracized by your peers, being mocked by the nominal Catholic or unbeliever and even being rejected by others we love.
