UPS AND DOWNS

We have received the final decision from the NYC Building's Department allowing us to install our church elevator, but limiting it to provide accessibility to Cabrini Hall, the street level at Hicks Street and the Main Church. While we had been advocating for the inclusion of the Choir Loft, since our shaft needed to extend to the height anyway, the NYC Building's Department would not allow it. The City would have only permitted a fourth stop had we changed the elevator selected and purchased a more commercial elevator adding an additional \$100,000 to the purchase price. Unfortunately, we do not have an additional \$100,000, and upon review, believe that what we have been granted will allow access to our primary facilities located in the Main Church and Cabrini Hall. Since receiving this decision, our architects have done a final sign off of the elevator drawings and met on-site with Msgr. Massie, John Heyer and Mobility Elevator Company to finalize all necessary options. Mobility has given us a maximum timeline starting from this week until final sign off by the New York City Elevator Inspectors of 10 weeks till completion. This means that we can look forward to riding in our new elevator at the end of the summer. Once again, thank you to all who have made this project possible by your donation to Generations of Faith. Please continue to make your regular payments ensuring our ability to see this project through to completion.

JUST A REMINDER

We welcome everyone to our Church. We welcome our parishioners, we welcome all those who are Catholic from other parishes, we welcome non-Catholic Christians from every denomination. We welcome those of the Jewish faith and Muslim faith. We welcome those who are Buddhists and those who are not affiliated with any faith community. We welcome the non believer as well as those who are searching. We welcome all regardless of age, gender or orientation. Unfortunately I cannot welcome everyone to communion. The present discipline of the Catholic Church admits baptized Catholics who are spiritually prepared for the Eucharist. I do invite all to pray with us. Last week we celebrated the Feast of Corpus Christi. We focused on the Catholic Doctrine of the Eucharist. We believe the Eucharist is the Body and Blood of the Risen Lord. The Eucharist unites us with Christ and with each other in a unity of faith. It is for this reason that the disciple of the Catholic Church cannot admit to Eucharist those who are not Catholic. We lament the lack of unity among Christians, we regret not being able to share the Eucharist. We hope and pray for the day when this will be possible but for now, we ask non Catholics to come up for a blessing rather than Eucharist. For a blessing, simply cross your arms over your heart and a priest will give a blessing. We ask those who are not able to receive Eucharist sacramentally to make a spiritual communion by asking the Lord to come into your heart and soul. If you are Catholic, you should be in a state of grace to receive communion. If you are married only civilly and not in the Catholic Church, you may want to refrain from receiving Eucharist and seek to discuss your situation with me or a priest of your own choosing. If you have not been to the sacrament of Reconciliation and you are conscience of having committed serious sins like being absent from Sunday Mass, being sick is an exception, you should approach the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The Sacrament of Reconciliation helps us to be introspective. The Sacrament calls us to self examination of our actions, our thoughts and our intentions. The Sacrament calls us into the presence of Christ to experience his mercy and face the truth about ourselves.

From the Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

The summer season is upon us. Last week I had mentioned that we are now in Ordinary Time. The color of Ordinary Time is Green. Green is the color of hope and spiritual growth. Our growth and life in Christ comes from our reflections on the readings at Mass and our reflective reception of the Eucharist. Today's readings speak to us about the slow but steady growth of the Kingdom of God.

Jesus preached the coming of the Kingdom of God. The Beatitudes found in Matthew 5, the Acts of Mercy found in Matthew 25 are two examples of the actions which bring about the Kingdom of God. In the Lord's Prayer we pray: "Your Kingdom come." What we are asking for is that God's way or God's rule for the world. In praying for the coming of the Kingdom of God, we are actually saying that our world, our lives, our relationships are not what they can be or should be. We are asking that our lives be ruled by God. The Kingdom, for which we long, is one where there is harmony among all. This Kingdom will be marked by love, peace, joy, kindness, faithfulness, goodness, humility, modesty, patience, generosity, gentleness, self-control, forgiveness and healing. The Kingdom would restore harmony in the cosmos, nature and humanity will be at peace. In short, the world would be a better place. Our own worlds would be peace filled.

How does this dream of Jesus come about? It comes about by following the Gospel. Has the world improved over the years? I think it has. With the growth of mutual understanding, lessening of fear through dialogue and the advances in the sciences, life on this planet has gotten better. However, do we have deep problems? I think we have a long way to go. The Kingdom of God comes about in our own small worlds by living the attitudes of the Gospel. One of the affects of worship and reception of the Eucharist is to be the Body of Christ in the worlds in which we live by making our worlds better.

How can you and I make a difference and make our worlds better? There is an increase of violence in our world. Try to respond to difficult situations without violent language no matter how difficult this may be for you. We are living in times where there seems to be a growing fear of the other who may be different due to race, religion, color or orientation. When tempted to be hateful or prejudiced towards another, try to see that person also made in the image of God. We are living in a world of self centeredness. Choose to be other centered even when this is frustrating. We are living at a time when many people are angry and not open to hearing the ideas of others. Listen more and challenge without arguing. We are living at a time when we need to let go of negative past experiences through forgiveness of the past and moving on to the future. We are living at a time and in a Church when the message of the Gospel has to be more shown than preached.

Preaching, giving good example, teaching the Gospel value to the next generation is an on-going process which we may never see completed or we may see little results. In faith we pass on the Gospel in the hope that it will grow in the hearts of others by the grace of the Holy Spirit. Lord make us instruments of your peace.
