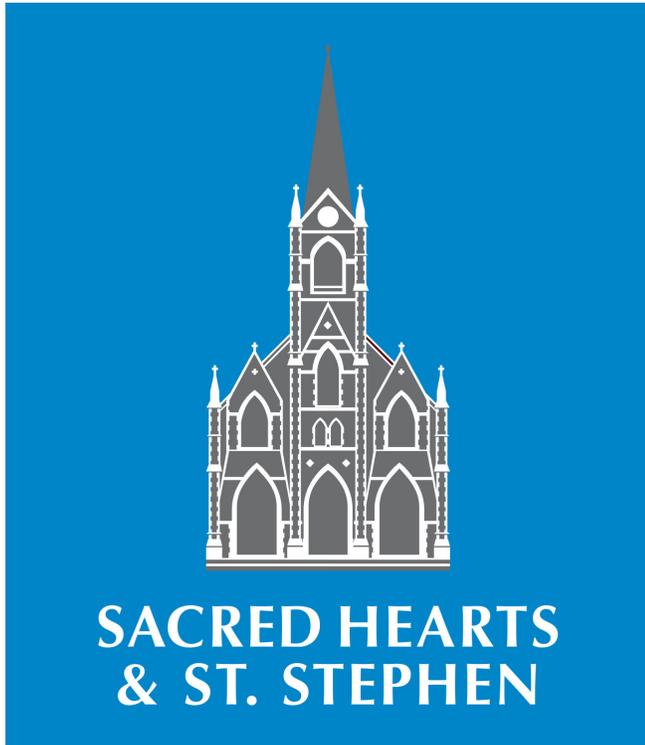



From the Pastor

Dear Parish Family:

Discipleship is the theme of the readings for this Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. In the second reading, Baptism is presented as the door to discipleship. In the first reading, hospitality is seen as the way of providing for the disciple.

The Gospel is very demanding. We are told in the Gospel that to be a disciple, our love for Christ must come first even above family commitments and relationships. We are told that discipleship means bearing the cross and even suffering the consequences for loving Christ. This invitation is rather difficult. Disciples are important to Jesus. Jesus is important to the disciples. Through the disciple, Jesus will reach many people and through the disciple, many will be brought to Jesus.

Baptism is the way of becoming a disciple. In the second reading Paul speaks to us about baptism. Baptism is the most important of sacraments. Through baptism we become part of the body of Christ. (the church) Through baptism we become sharers in all that Jesus did. In baptism the Holy Spirit appropriates the redemption Christ accomplished through his death and resurrection to us. In Baptism The Holy Trinity dwells deep within us. Baptism is an adult commitment to Christ. We baptize children because of the request of believing parents. Parents take on a serious responsibility before God when they request the baptism of their child. They promise to pass the faith on to their children. To fulfill this obligation before God, the parent should be practicing in the faith. In the end, the parent, not the child, is answerable to God for this obligation. Baptism is so important that during the Easter celebration we are all asked to renew our baptismal promises. It is true we have baptized many adults in our RCIA. Those who search for baptism as adults usually make great Catholics and take nothing for granted. If you want your faith renewed, speak with a newly baptized person.

As one ages and grows in baptismal grace, sin becomes less attractive and faith more meaningful. Faith and our relationship with Christ is a serious matter. How do we love Christ above all things and all relationships? The faith through the Holy Spirit directs our attitudes, our behavior and knowledge of right and wrong. The faith through the Holy Spirit inspires us to do good and avoid evil. The faith through the Holy Spirit moves us to make sacrifices for the benefit of others. The Holy Spirit leads us to be less self centered and more other centered. The faith moves us to love for the sake of Christ and not for personal gain or popularity. Living out our baptismal promises is the way to discipleship.

Where are we with Baptism? In our day many people request baptism for their children. Many raise the child in the faith. Many have no intention of raising the child in the faith. In some cases, baptism has become more a social event rather than a commitment to the faith. Where are you with your own baptism? Do you know the date and place of your baptism? Do you focus on the baptismal promises when preparing for the sacrament of reconciliation? In today's reading, Paul was worried that his people were not living out their baptismal promises. Would Paul have to worry about you?

CHURCH OPEN FOR MASS

Beginning Monday, June 29th our Church will be open for the public to attend Weekday and Weekend Mass. Mass times will be as follows: Weekdays, Monday—Saturday 8:30 AM, Saturday Evening 5:00 PM, Sunday at 8:00 AM, 10:00 AM and Noon. The church will remain open from Noon to 2:00 PM each day for private prayer.

Msgr. Massie will have a Tea and Talk live on Facebook on Sunday, June 28th at 11:30 AM to answer your questions about public celebration of Mass.

GUIDELINES FOR ATTENDING MASS

The following has been provided by the Diocese of Brooklyn as requirements for the opening of our parish for public celebration of Mass.

During Mass, all guideline as established for visiting Church must be maintained to ensure social distancing and not exceed the 25% capacity.

At Sacred Hearts-St. Stephen the maximum capacity for the church is now 50 people.

Anyone entering the church must wear a face mask, use the hand sanitizing stations upon entering and wipe down their pew with the provided wipes before leaving.

All ministers for the mass (celebrant, server, lector) must sanitize their hands before mass begins.

What Mass will look like: There will be no entrance procession for all Masses, Sunday and weekday. There will be no missals or worship aids available. Parishioners are encouraged to bring their own from home or use their smartphones. There will be no exchange of peace and no holding of hands at the Lord's Prayer. There will be no offertory collection. Parishioners are to be encouraged to use e-giving at GiveCentral.org/shss or leave their donation in the offering box at the entrance of the church in the center with the white cross on it. People should come for communion in the normal way observing 6 feet of distance between them as they approach. **At SHSS the faithful will only be able to receive Holy Communion in the hand. The communicant should come before the Minister of Communion with the mask on for the dialogue (The Body of Christ, Amen) and then, moving to the side, lower the mask and consume the Eucharist and replace the mask.**

Holy Communion will be distributed by the celebrant. The host will be allowed to "fall" (reverently) into the communicant's hand to avoid any physical contact. The hands should be disinfected before distribution of Holy Communion. Hand disinfectant should be available nearby those distributing Holy Communion. The precious blood is not to be distributed to the faithful. There is to be no recessional procession. There should be no stopping to greet parishioners as they depart the church.

Music ministry should be limited to the organist and a cantor using social distancing. The cantor should not sing from the same place from which the lector reads. Choirs should not be used at this time since social distancing will be impossible for them. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion should only be used if there are not enough priests in the parish to assist.
