From the Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

Today, the Twenty Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, the themes of the first reading from the Book of the Prophet Ezekiel and the Gospel are: forgiveness, reconciliation, unity and united prayer. For the sake of our discussion, I shall like to address the theme of reconciliation and unity for the greater good of the community or the church.

In the first reading we meet the prophet Ezekiel. Ezekiel has been appointed watchman for the house of Israel. The task of watchman was to warn the people of approaching danger. In this case, the prophet is not warning the people of physical danger but of moral danger. The moral danger is sin. He is a messenger of hope. The warning was to give people a time to change their lives for the better according to the Law of God.

In the Gospel according to St. Matthew, we read how the community was to address community scandal or community sin. The gospel lists the categories of how to work towards reconciliation and unity. The unity of the community was and still is important. This section of the Gospel of Matthew seems to reflect not the time of Jesus, but rather a later development in the evolution of the early Christian Community. The directives are good practice of opening up dialogue as a vehicle of reconciliation. The steps described are:

1. If a person feels wronged by the community, that person should speak directly to the person or to a responsible member or leader of the community. The person should not fester in anger and share the wrong with others as to gossip but try to seek to repair the hurt or misunderstanding.
2. The person should meet face-to-face with the person or the representative of the community and speak. Writing a letter, e-mails and texts are not the way. These methods can be misunderstood and are often used to avoid the issue.
3. If the personal one-on-one fails, then maybe take a third or fourth party and meet again so as to get to the truth of the matter with others listening and perhaps acting as facilitators.
4. If the meeting with others has failed then the case should be referred to the community. A disagreement between Christians was to be settled in the community. Bringing cases to the court may settle the legal issues but personal relationships can be lost and never repaired.
5. If all else fails, then separate from them with the hope and an open mind that the issue may be settled at a future date at another time which may be more conducive to reconciliation of the issue.

So, who has not had a disagreement, who has not been hurt by another, who has not stopped talking to someone? We are all in this boat. Do we want the anger and hurt to last forever? Do we want to try to reconcile? Do we enjoy our disagreement? Do we still revel in our hurt so we can tell everyone how hurt we are, making ourselves the center of the story? Do we want to be a disciple and follow the direction of Jesus or do we want to hold on to the anger?
