REACH OUT

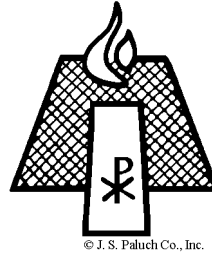

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From the Pastor

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CHRISTMAS

Dear Parish Family, Visitors and all People of Good Will,

I wish you the Joy and Peace of this Christmas Season.

We are living in challenging times. The Covid Pandemic has monopolized every aspect of our lives. Our nation is disunited. Our church struggles with scandal and the world seems paralyzed with this pandemic. There is civil unrest. There is an increase of violence. Our children are learning how to learn in a whole new way. We are all zoomed out with on-line meetings, classes and even social calls. There are many who are seriously ill. Most, if not every family seems to be facing a serious issue. Christians in certain parts of the world are being persecuted, if not killed. There is a rise in racism, anti-Semitism and even a call for white supremacy. What is happening? It is not a good time for many. It is not a merry time for many.

So, where are we with this Christmas Celebration? It seems that we have many options when answering this question. Let us remember the feast has nothing to do with the way you or I feel at this present moment. It has everything to do with Jesus. Christ is the only one who can save us from all the negativity we are now facing. So we remember Christ came to save us from sin, death and even from ourselves. It is all about Christ. We are celebrating Christ. Therefore, everything you plan to do should come from this conviction. The decorating of the church or your home is done because of Christ. The meal you are planning is the social extension of the Eucharist we celebrate for Christmas. The gifts we exchange are symbols of the gift that Christ is to all of us. What is necessary for a great celebration of Christmas? The proper disposition of the heart is necessary. Even if the externals are not exactly perfect, and even if we will gather in small groups this Christmas, a loving heart is always the correct disposition. So, lower your stress levels.

Look at the Christmas Story. God enters creation and everything is turned upside down. Mary's life is changed for all eternity. Her surprise vocation to be the Mother of God, to give humanity to the Divine caused Joseph stress, not to mention what it did to their respective families. If that is not enough, life becomes complicated by a census. The census makes it necessary to travel from Nazareth to Bethlehem. Things go from bad to worse. Mary and Joseph discover there is no room for them and the child is born in a dark cave where animals were kept. Light comes at the darkest moments. God happens when God wills, even when all is in disarray. The Light penetrated the darkness. The darkness will not overcome this light who is Christ. The shepherds followed the light, those seeking wisdom followed the light, those who were of good will followed the light, those who wanted a world ruled by God followed the light.

Christ enters into our lives when we may be least prepared. Christ breaks into our darkness when he wills. God's time table is different from our time table. So in the midst of surprises, setbacks, disappointments, good news and bad news and general anxieties of life, God enters. The Lord knocks on the door of our hearts and asks for acceptance into our busy lives. Sometimes Jesus knocks on our door in times of good news, sometimes in times of hurt and disappointment, sometimes with an invitation to change and accept situations we find difficult. Jesus, known as Emmanuel, that is God with us, is present to us. This presence does not always take away suffering or the difficulties, the divine presence accompanies us and guides us to change what we can and accept what we cannot change. Emmanuel (God with us), the Incarnate Word of God invites us to incarnate in our actions and Christ's attitudes: mercy, love, peace, joy, self-giving, self-sacrifice, service, healing, forgiveness. In this we begin to shine the eternal light on those around us.

We find this light in the Eucharist. In the reception of Holy Communion we encounter the Lord. Eucharist is the most greatest sacrament and the most important place to find the presence of Emmanuel. We find Jesus in our sacred stories known as the scriptures. What is the story saying to you? Where do you find yourself in the Gospel message? God, Emmanuel God with us is found in ourselves and in other people. We see this God present with us when we see true compassion, hear a cry for justice for the oppressed. We discover this light when mercy is given, forgiveness is extended and genuine self-giving love is shared. Christ is present with us in ways we cannot imagine or even request.

The mystery of God becoming Flesh is overwhelming. It is a great gift because God has come to share our lives. When we sincerely share our lives with others, when we serve each other out of love and not obligation, God is present. So, choose to celebrate the presence of God with us by simply being with others.
