


Dear Parish Family:

The Gospel today gives us reason to pause and ponder the answer that Jesus gives to those who question him regarding paying taxes to Caesar. Jesus says: "Then repay Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." How are we to understand that answer? Does not everything belong to God? Is there anything that does not belong to God? Life is from God. In the first reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, even Cyrus the pagan King of Persia seems to belong to God. Isaiah believed that Cyrus was an instrument through whom God worked to end the exile thus affecting the return of the people of Israel back to their land. Even if Cyrus did not know he was an instrument of God, God is recognized as the God of history. All times and all seasons belong to God. So how do we return to God what already belongs to God? If Caesar's power extends only over the Roman Empire and God is unlimited and universal, does paying the tax limit one's loyalty to God?

"Is it lawful according to the Law of Israel to pay taxes to Caesar? This was a perplexing and complicated question for all Jewish groups at the time of Jesus. The Tax was a constant and clear reminder to the Jews that they were held in subjugation to Rome. Therefore, the Tax itself was oppressive. There existed and still exists many Jewish sects at the time of Jesus as well as in our own day. Therefore one must be careful not to generalize the Jews or Jewish opinions on issues. With regard to the Poll Tax levied by the Roman Empire, there are different opinions. The Pharisees paid the tax under protest because they saw the tax as supporting paganism and oppression. The Pharisees charge of paganism is because the emperor saw himself as a god. The Sadducees paid the tax without question because they favored a cooperative relationship with the Roman Empire. The Herodians who supported King Herod, did not question the tax because it helped keep Herod, a Jewish King in power although he was a puppet of the Roman Empire. The Zealot Party members saw the tax as a cause for revolution against the Roman Empire. These questions can be found in the Talmud. (While not scripture, the Talmud is a text which seeks to assist the believing Jew how to live out the law of God in every aspect of one's life.) Thus the problem with the payment of the Tax had to do with paganism and oppression of the people.

The question places Jesus in a difficult position. He was being set up by his opponents. Jesus is placed between the Roman Empire and Religious law. Jesus is being placed in the midst of the Pharisees, the Sadducees and the Herodians all of whom had their respective interpretations of the Law. Jesus realizes he had to avoid support of one over the others and still remain true to his faith and morality. If Jesus endorsed the Tax, he would be seen as siding with the Romans against his own people. If Jesus opposed the Tax, he would be seen as an enemy of the state. Thus, the answer Jesus gives is the best and to the point. If God is the God of History, does even Caesar belong to God? Does paying the Tax violate one's faithfulness to God? Jesus leaves it up to the payer of the tax. One must also remember that national refusal of payment of this Tax could have caused the Romans to destroy the city of Jerusalem. Thus, with the payment, the Jews could survive and worship with little or no interference from Rome. In times of controversy, we must use wisdom. Jesus is most wise in his answer. For us we may ask is everything legal moral? If we must follow and support the law of the land, how do we live our morality? Whose task is it to uphold the moral law at times over and above the civil Law?
