From the Pastor

Dear Parish Community:

Today is the Fourth Sunday of Easter. This Sunday is known as Good Shepherd Sunday. This Sunday has traditionally been dedicated to vocations to the priesthood, the Diaconate and religious life.

The image of God as the Good Shepherd is ancient. Shepherds refer to all who have responsibility for the spiritual care of the people. While God is the shepherd par excellence, those who care for the spiritual needs of others are to imitate the care and love of God for his people. Besides the beloved psalm 23 and psalm 80 addresses God as the Shepherd of Israel, imploring God as the Shepherd of salvation and deliverance. Through the prophets, God addressed the unfaithful shepherds and promised to shepherd his own people due to the lack of care on behalf of the erring shepherds. King David was a shepherd. Images of lambs and sheep symbolic and metaphorical for the people of Israel abound in the sacred text.

The qualities of a shepherd best illustrate the qualities needed to be a person of pastoral care. Shepherds are vigilant. The Good Shepherd sometimes leads the sheep by walking in front of them. At other times, the shepherd is in the midst of the sheep sharing the sheep's very life. Other times the shepherd walks behind the flock to defend them from danger. The shepherd always has the good of the sheep at heart. They are present for the sheep. The shepherd is interested in the individual sheep as well as the herd of sheep. Shepherds must be kind but firm. They must be truthful but gentle. They above all must love the sheep. They must be willing to sacrifice themselves when necessary for the good of the sheep.

The relationship between the sheep and the shepherd is personal and communal. It is personal in that the sheep knows and loves the shepherd and the shepherd knows and loves the sheep. The Gospel addresses those of us who are shepherds and would be shepherds in the church. The shepherd calls us all. Yet, there are many voices who call out to us. There is the voice of self, the world, the world of business, the world of immediate gratification, the world of power and many others that vie for our attention. How do we know the voice of the Good Shepherd? Who guides us to recognizing the voice of the shepherd? How do we follow the Good Shepherd? The guide is the Sacred Texts, the sacraments and the traditions of the Church. Anyone in leadership must imitate the example of the Good Shepherd. "The Lord is my shepherd there is nothing I shall want. Ps. 23"
