MUSIC NEWS

Do you know someone in the parish choirs? Be sure to thank them for all their hard work and dedication! Mille grazie to our Children's Choir, Youth Choir and Adult Choir for their beautiful singing at the Holy Week liturgies! The Youth Choir will be here again next Sunday, May 5th at the 10:00 AM Mass.

Notes on the Pipe Organ: As detailed in this column before Easter, our venerable old pipe organ is suffering from years of wear and tear, dust and water damage. Thank God for our choirs and instrumentalists, who so fabulously brought the Holy Week music to life, despite the limited capabilities of the organ in its current condition. Restoration of the instrument has been examined, and is an expensive undertaking. It may be worth it. We are fortunate to have inherited such a magnificent instrument from the previous generations of this parish. To purchase a comparable authentic pipe organ nowadays would cost several million dollars. The organ is one of the most valuable assets we have, and its work is to inspire all who hear it.

UPS AND DOWNS

After 2 1/2 years since beginning our church elevator project, on Friday, February 22nd, the NYC Buildings Department certified our church elevator for regular use. This is a great moment in the history of our parish as we make our worship and community space accessible to all who wish to worship regardless of their physical abilities. However, we have not yet completed our project. The installation of the automated door openers at the Hicks Street side and in the church have been ordered and are scheduled to be installed in the next 3 weeks. New signs for each floor and the outside of the building have been ordered and will be installed soon. Lastly, the marble wall covering in the lobby of the church and finishing paint around each of the landings must also be finished. At this time, it is once again appropriate to thank in a special way our architects Baxt Ingui Architects, P.C. who have donated of their services to this project including their project management staff. Remember that it is our support of the Generations of Faith Capital Campaign which has allowed this work to be done. We still need your financial support in order to complete all aspects of this project. Parish donors have already paid \$581,665 of the \$783,765 pledged to the campaign. If you have made a pledge to Generations of Faith please continue to make your payments allowing us to fully fund our parish elevator. We look forward to updating you further in the days ahead.

Dear Parish Family, .

ALLELUIA! CHRIST IS RISEN! ALLELUIA!

Today is the Second Sunday of Easter. This day is also known as the eighth day of Easter of the Octave of Easter. This entire week which we just completed, was called Easter Week. The liturgies of this past week were all Easter Liturgies. The Gospel readings for each day actually all took place on Easter Sunday. The Paschal Mystery of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ are too big to be contained in one day. The Church celebrates Easter Sunday for eight days. Today we conclude our Easter Octave celebration and the Easter Season now begins. Each Sunday of the Easter Season will have an Easter theme. However, we must keep in mind that every Sunday of the year is a Paschal Celebration. We come together on Sunday because of the great events of Easter.

Today we conclude our Easter Octave with the celebration of Divine Mercy. Listen carefully to the readings. The apostles are gathered in the upper room. They are a sorry lot. They are filled with worry. They are feeling guilty over their abandoning Jesus in his hour of greatest need. They are probably filled with grief over his death. They saw Jesus as their friend and their teacher. Jesus had changed their lives. They may have been angry with Judas for having betrayed Jesus. They may have even been angry with Jesus, thinking that they were duped into following him and his message. Now, because of their association with Jesus, they could be considered criminals. In short, they are a wounded, hurt and suffering community.

Now focus on Thomas. He separates himself from the community. He goes off by himself and grieves the loss of Jesus. He is hurt, he is angry and he does not believe any good can happen again. Thomas is wounded. He is isolated from the others in his thoughts, feelings and even his beliefs.

Now focus on Jesus. Jesus entered the upper room. Resurrection does not resuscitate. Resurrection means risen in the body but changed. It means sprit-filled. It means that while Jesus is recognizable, he is changed. While the life of Jesus prior to the resurrection seemed to focus on his humanity, the life of Jesus after resurrection focuses on his divinity. Jesus is recognized by the apostles as being the same Jesus they knew but he is changed. Notice that Jesus comes to them and grants them peace. He does not mention their unfaithfulness. He knows how they feel. Jesus not only gives his life for them, he now breathes The Holy Spirit upon them. Jesus breathes new life into this apostles like the Prophet Ezekiel spoke the Word of God over the dry bones of Israel giving them new life (cf Ezekiel 37). Notice that Jesus shows his wounds on his body to the wounded body of the apostles. It is through the wound of Jesus that we can peer into and see his divinity. It is from his wounded side and hands that Jesus forgives, bestows mercy and rehabilitates Thomas and the apostles. At the end of the Gospel passage, we see that mercy triumphs. The apostles will proclaim redemption and salvation in Christ Jesus to the world. The only beatitude in the Gospel of John will be uttered about us. "Blessed are those who have not seen, yet still believe."

Today there are many of us who are wounded. Even the Church, the Body of Christ, suffers from wounds. Some of us have long standing issues with the Church leadership. Some of us are angry and hurt enough by scandals of the clergy and the behavior of Catholics, to leave the community. Some of us are disappointed in life in general. Some of us are angry with God. Some of us are angry with ourselves. Some of us are or were victims of crime, injustice, hurt and neglect. Some of us have sinned and some of us have made terrible mistakes. All of us are human. All of us are strong and weak at the same time. All of us share both the apostles; John's faithfulness to Christ and Peter's denial of Christ. Some have even betrayed both Christ and his Gospel by the way we have lived and acted. Yet, today and in this season, we are reminded that Mercy's is available for all who are sorry and who wish to strive to amend their lives. We are a sinful Church, a sinful priesthood and a sinful weak people. We all need Mercy. No one is exempt. No sin is so grave, no tomb so dark and no life is so far from the Victory of Christ. If you have been away, come home. If you are here, rejoice in God's Mercy.
