MUSIC NEWS

Do you know someone in the parish choirs? Be sure to thank them for all their hard work and dedication! Mille grazie to our Children's Choir, Youth Choir and Adult Choir for their beautiful singing at the Holy Week liturgies! The Youth Choir will be here again next Sunday, May 5th at the 10:00 AM Mass.

Notes on the Pipe Organ: As detailed in this column before Easter, our venerable old pipe organ is suffering from years of wear and tear, dust and water damage. Thank God for our choirs and instrumentalists, who so fabulously brought the Holy Week music to life, despite the limited capabilities of the organ in its current condition. Restoration of the instrument has been examined, and is an expensive undertaking. It may be worth it. We are fortunate to have inherited such a magnificent instrument from the previous generations of this parish. To purchase a comparable authentic pipe organ nowadays would cost several million dollars. The organ is one of the most valuable assets we have, and its work is to inspire all who hear it.

UPS AND DOWNS

After 2 1/2 years since beginning our church elevator project, on Friday, February 22nd, the NYC Buildings Department certified our church elevator for regular use. This is a great moment in the history of our parish as we make our worship and community space accessible to all who wish to worship regardless of their physical abilities. However, we have not yet completed our project. The installation of the automated door openers at the Hicks Street side and in the church have been ordered and are scheduled to be installed in the next 3 weeks. New signs for each floor and the outside of the building have been ordered and will be installed soon. Lastly, the marble wall covering in the lobby of the church and finishing paint around each of the landings must also be finished. At this time, it is once again appropriate to thank in a special way our architects Baxt Ingui Architects, P.C. who have donated of their services to this project including their project management staff. Remember that it is our support of the Generations of Faith Capital Campaign which has allowed this work to be done. We still need your financial support in order to complete all aspects of this project. Parish donors have already paid \$581,665 of the \$783,765 pledged to the campaign. If you have made a pledge to Generations of Faith please continue to make your payments allowing us to fully fund our parish elevator. We look forward to updating you further in the days ahead.

Dear Parish Community:

Today, the Fourth Sunday of Easter has traditionally been called Good Shepherd Sunday. The readings present the image of God as a shepherd of the people. In Psalm 80, God is called the Shepherd of Israel. The beloved Psalm 23, the Lord is My Shepherd is the most familiar image of God's nature as one who truly cares for his people. The Prophet Ezekiel wrote of God as the Shepherd of Israel. King David was a shepherd when he was called by Samuel to be King of Israel. In the New Testament we read in 1Peter 5:4 that Jesus is the chief Shepherd of the Church. In John 21, we read how Jesus asked Peter to tend and feed his sheep. The New Testament image of the Good Shepherd is related to the Cross of Christ. It is the Shepherd who lays down his life for the good of the sheep. The image of the Shepherd is well established in scripture.

Seeing God as Shepherd conjures up images of the Lord's compassion, understanding, forgiveness, gentleness, healing, empathy, love and mercy on our behalf. It is not surprising that seeing Christ as Shepherd is one of the most popular and preferred images by Christian peoples. However, the Shepherd is also the leader of the sheep. The Shepherd is charged with the responsibility of doing the best for the sheep even when the sheep are not pleased with the shepherd. The shepherd has to be loving and compassionate but he also needs to be a leader. Correcting, calling out, prodding and even poking the sheep with his staff to move them out of danger is the job of the shepherd. Shepherds are usually disinterested in their own popularity with the sheep and are more interested in discerning the good for his following.

In our own day and age, the Church is a shepherd of the faithful of Christ. The role of the shepherd is taken up by bishops and pastors. In family life, the role of the shepherd is found in the parents. Shepherding role is found in places where there is absolute dedication to those being served without worry of reward. The one who is the caregiver lays down one's life for the good of another. Sometimes the service of the shepherd is not appreciated or recognized by those being served. Sometimes the shepherd suffers because of or on behalf of the sheep. In the end, the role of the shepherd is one of unconditional love, mercy and compassion. May God send us disciples who love us.
