From the Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

Here we are in the summer of 2020. Summertime is a growing season. The liturgical color of Ordinary Time is green. The Church is decorated in green. Green is the color of spiritual growth and life. Green is the color of hope. Many of the crops which were sown in the spring will grow through the summer and be harvested in the fall. Today's readings speak to us of sowing and harvesting. In the first reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah we are told that God sends his Word to the world and God's Word will accomplish all that God wishes to accomplish. The gospel tells us the parable of the sowing of seed and the harvesting of the produce. St. Paul tells us in the reading from his letter to the Romans that all creation is groaning as it awaits the fullness of redemption.

In the first reading we are told that God has sent his Word and the Word will accomplish all that God wills. For us the Word of God is not only God's spoken Word, but a person. Jesus is the Word of God made flesh. Jesus comes and plants the seeds of redemption. Yet we still await. The second reading says the fullness of that redemption. We need to keep in mind that God sends his Word eternally not just once. Our belief is that in time the Word will be victorious.

What do we learn from these readings? First we learn not to give up. Our job, my job, the vocation of the church is to proclaim the Gospel. Sometimes we are gratified and see a difference in the life of people due to the message of the Gospel and the celebration of the Sacraments. Sometimes people do convert to a deeper meaning of life in the Spirit due to our efforts. We must keep in mind that it is God who works through us to accomplish great things. At other times we will not see positive results of ministries. In fact, we may feel our work for the Gospel in vain. So see yourself as a priest or a religious who teaches, gives good example and finds that their people or students really have rejected all the value systems you have tried to pass on. Will they realize this importance of the values which you sought to pass on in time? Who knows? Think of the parent who has done a great job of modeling of the Gospel values of faith, love and hope only to have children who we love are no longer practicing the faith you cherished not being practiced by the next generation. Think of the lack of vocations which we are now experiencing. What does that say to those who dedicated their entire lives to the Gospel? Our vocation is to preach the Gospel in good times and in bad times. It is our vocation to never forsake hope that maybe one or two people will get the message and hand it on.

Secondly, we must not look back to see our accomplishments. It is not the preacher or the teacher or the priest who touches the heart of a person, rather it is the Word of God which may come through us which brings about a change of heart. Thirdly, we must minister with hope and conviction of heart. Perhaps if we are convinced in the truth of the Gospel, we need to be more confident in our own message of the Gospel. In the end, God wins.

GUIDELINES FOR ATTENDING MASS

The following has been provided by the Diocese of Brooklyn as requirements for the opening of our parish for public celebration of Mass.

During Mass, all guideline as established for visiting Church must be maintained to ensure social distancing and not exceed the 25% capacity.

At Sacred Hearts-St. Stephen the maximum capacity for the church is now 50 people.

Anyone entering the church must wear a face mask, use the hand sanitizing stations upon entering and wipe down their pew with the provided wipes before leaving.

All ministers for the mass (celebrant, server, lector) must sanitize their hands before mass begins.

What Mass will look like: There will be no entrance procession for all Masses, Sunday and weekday. There will be no missals or worship aids available. Parishioners are encouraged to bring their own from home or use their smartphones. There will be no exchange of peace and no holding of hands at the Lord's Prayer. There will be no offertory collection. Parishioners are to be encouraged to use e-giving at GiveCentral.org/shss or leave their donation in the offering box at the entrance of the church in the center with the white cross on it. People should come for communion in the normal way observing 6 feet of distance between them as they approach. **At SHSS the faithful will only be able to receive Holy Communion in the hand. The communicant should come before the Minister of Communion with the mask on for the dialogue (The Body of Christ, Amen) and then, moving to the side, lower the mask and consume the Eucharist and replace the mask.**

Holy Communion will be distributed by the celebrant. The host will be allowed to "fall" (reverently) into the communicant's hand to avoid any physical contact. The hands should be disinfected before distribution of Holy Communion. Hand disinfectant should be available nearby those distributing Holy Communion. The precious blood is not to be distributed to the faithful. There is to be no recessional procession. There should be no stopping to greet parishioners as they depart the church.

Music ministry should be limited to the organist and a cantor using social distancing. The cantor should not sing from the same place from which the lector reads. Choirs should not be used at this time since social distancing will be impossible for them. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion should only be used if there are not enough priests in the parish to assist.
