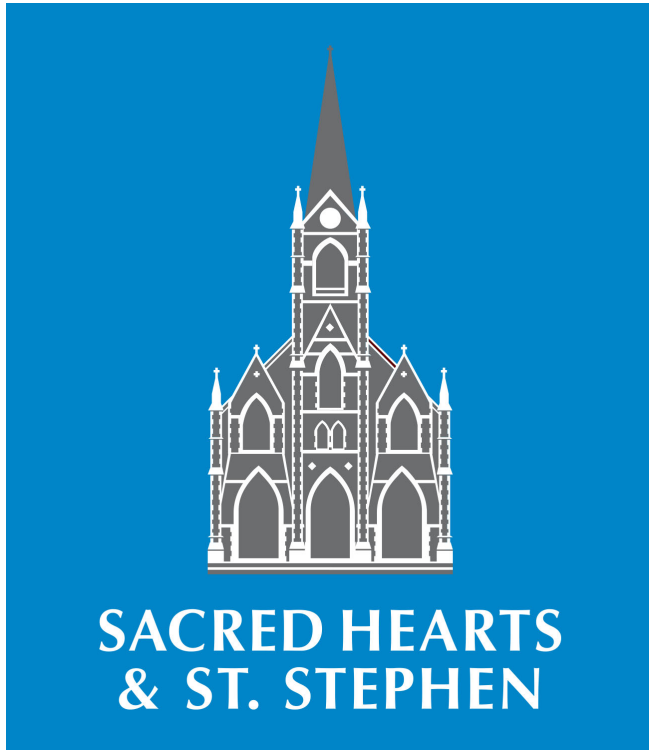

REACH OUT

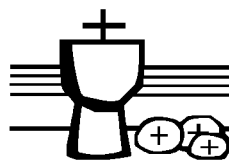

From the Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

Today's Liturgy of the Word is challenging to us to have faith, to love, to be persistent, to have courage and never give up hope in the Lord. To understand the three readings this Sunday, it will be helpful to review some points about the ministry of Jesus. We are used to a Jesus who comes for all. We accept the universal message of the Gospel for all people at all times. This acceptance is true, however, the universality of the Gospel message as we have today, happened after the Resurrection. The universal message of the Gospel came most perfectly through the preaching of St. Paul. In the Gospel today, we are in a time period before the Resurrection and certainly prior to Paul. (However we must remember the Gospel is written well after the Resurrection.) Today we are at a point of development.

The primary mission of Jesus was to the Jewish people of his time. So, when in the Gospel Jesus says "my mission is to the lost of the house of Israel," it is a true statement. Remember, Jesus is spearheading a movement which is primarily a Jewish event. So, the first concern of Jesus is to the Jewish people, not the gentiles or the non-Jews. In Matthew 10, Jesus sends his disciples out only to Jewish Territory not to gentile territory. The Gospel message would go to the gentile world after the Resurrection.

The Canaanite woman is a gentile. She is from a people who were traditional enemies of the Jewish People. While ethnicity plays a lesser role in our American society than it once did, in Biblical times it was a major concern. The Israelites had believed themselves to be a people, a nation a community that had a particular calling to be the People of God. There were benefits and consequences for their special status. They had to walk in the ways of the Lord as revealed by the Torah. There was not a belief in universality that the Catholic Church has today. While all could have a relationship with God, the Israelite relationship was special. The mission of Jesus was first to the Jewish People, not to the Gentile world. The call to the gentile world would come later. Yet, Jesus will praise the faith of this woman. Her faith was not doctrinal, it was deeply personal. She calls Jesus Lord. She believes in him. Jesus has crossed outside of Jewish territory and he is in present day Lebanon. He comes to this place to seek rest. He is recognized by this woman. What is Jesus to do?

There are many understandings of this story. Jesus himself perhaps as a man is startled that his message is being accepted by the non-Jewish world. He also may be coming to realize that his message will have a universal appeal earlier than expected. The non-Jewish world comes to know Christ through the preaching of Paul and others. Jesus is compassionate, yet this woman is a pagan. Did she understand that he was more than a miracle worker? Did she understand that faith in him was necessary? Did she understand that his mission was one of service? Why did Jesus delay in his response to her?

The lesson of the day rests with the nameless woman. She teaches us several aspects of prayer. She seems to have faith. Notice her faith grew during the conversation with Jesus. She calls him at first Jesus, Son of David, have mercy. This title is a messianic title which recognized Jesus as a leader and a wonder worker. At the end of the Gospel she addresses him as Lord. Her faith grew. She had hope even when he would not speak with her. She loved. She was asking for a healing for a daughter. She even braved his rebuke for the sake of her daughter. She loved much. She was persistent. She had courage and she received her miracle.
