

From the Dear Parish Community, **Pastor**

Today the Liturgy celebrates the Feast of Christ the King. This feast opens the last week of the 2023 liturgical year. Next week, the first Sunday of Advent will begin the Liturgical Year 2024.

readings focus on the Kingship of Christ. We began the liturgical year 2023 by proclaiming the birth of the newborn King. During Holy Week we shouted out Hosanna to our King. On Good Friday we proclaimed the Kingship of Christ Crucified. Today we again give our loyalty to our King who is Christ the Lord.

The Gospel today seems to be the center of the Liturgy of the Word. We read in Ephesians 2:4 that God is rich in mercy. Mercy is love in brokenness. Mercy comes from the Latin word "misericordia" which means to suffer in one's heart over the pain of another. In today's Gospel those who are rewarded with eternal life are those whose hearts suffered for another and who in mercy sought in some way to relieve that suffering. Notice that Jesus identified with those in need of mercy. Jesus counts what was done for the suffering as being done to him. Notice also that those who were merciful did not calculate their merciful acts, in fact, they are moved to act in mercy from their hearts. We are told in the Gospel of John 14:24 that those who love Jesus will do as Jesus has done. Jesus is merciful and those who follow him must be merciful. This Gospel for today tells us that the requirement for eternal life is to be merciful.

Having read this Matthew 25, we have learned that to be merciful is to be most like God. If Christ is your king, then Mercy must be your life. If Christ is your King, then power is found in service of mercy. If Christ is your King, then your heart must be conformed to his heart. His heart is mercy. The Eucharist we celebrate, the prayers we pray, the faith we profess, the doctrine we proclaim and the Gospel we preach lead us to be people of mercy for God is merciful. If this is not happening, then we need to reexamine our love for Christ.

Our faith is centered in Christ Jesus. Our faith is founded on the Crucified and Risen Christ who is the beginning and the end. Christ is the one who has the words to everlasting life. Christ is our peace, our hope and our life. Today's feast reminds all the baptized that our lives are centered in a personal and ecclesiastical loving relationship with Christ. This means that our relationship with Christ is in the context of the Church, the sacraments, especially the Eucharist and the scriptures. All of us are invited to model our lives on Christ. St. Claire of Assisi in her letter to Agnes of Prague gives us good advice. She says: "Reflect upon Christ, Consider Christ, Contemplate Christ and Imitate Christ. These four steps lead us into deep prayer and reflection. Christ must be the center of our hearts. We are called to faith and to love the Lord. The Christian must be so in love with the Lord that he/she longs to give of him/herself to actualize the dream of Christ for the world: The Kingdom of God.

Live Jesus in your thoughts, words and deeds. Live Jesus in all that you are and all that you do. Live Christ in all that you suffer. Live Jesus so that our world and the many different worlds of home and work in which we dwell reflect his divine presence through us.
